





Dayana Hernandez, one of Costa Rica's most important trans-rights activists, dies at age 40.

Dayana died from long-term complications caused by biopolymer injections. She was an activist, and the first trans woman to stand as a deputy to the Legislative Assembly in 2018.

Lacking support for gender affirming care in Costa Rica's health system, trans people look for alternatives that are, most of the time, unsafe. They fall victim to systemic violence.



Costa Rica's President Fires Officials Over LGBT Pride March Support.

In June 2024, the government of Costa Rica fired two officials after they signed a declaration of cultural interest for the country's LGBT Pride March. The government claimed the march did not have the necessary permits, but the event organizers denied it. The Pride March organizers called the government's actions an illegal act and a populist move.



President declares he will veto trans rights law.

Law proposal 23.809, colloquially called "trans rights law" proposed by one minority political party. Its goal is to recognize the identity, rights to education, family, health services, and work for trans, nonbinary, intersex and gender-diverse people, both adults and minors.

Costa Rica's president declared that if the law gets to his desk, he will veto it. With comments such as "a 6-year-old wakes up saying I feel like a fish, I identify as a fish put scales on me and cut

me up, those are very weird things" and "analysts say it foments pedophilia, I will not sign that law. There is no discussion about that."



Non-governmental Organizations Brief the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women on the Situation of Women's Rights in Bahrain, Mauritania and Costa Rica.

Report by the United Nation's Human Rights Office.

Quotes from the report:

"Not only was there no guarantee of access to justice, but the Costa Rican justice system reproduced discriminatory practices against victims of violence, including State violence. Special State protection actions for minority groups, including indigenous women, rural women, and women with disabilities, among others, was also requested."

"Costa Rica should prohibit and penalise any action that sought to modify the sexual orientation or gender identity of lesbian, bisexual, transgender, intersex, and queer people. Costa Rica should also generate State policies aimed at promoting the employment of the transgender population. The Ministry of Labour was urged to carry out studies on complaints and administrative processes in workplaces on acts of discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity. It should also be guaranteed that intersex people were not subjected to surgeries without their consent."



Sexual Violence in Costa Rica: A Progressive Country with Regressive Gender Policies

Gender-based violence, although not a novel issue in international law, continues to affect nearly one in three women in the world.¹ While countries have signed treaties, passed domestic legislation, and pledged to protect women against gender-based violence, sexual violence has been blurred in national laws, lacking a comprehensive, universal definition.² Recent efforts to address sexual violence have been tailored to violations of international humanitarian law during war and armed conflict occurrences, overshadowing the day-to-day sexual attacks on women.³ Additionally, most countries suffer a legal "gap between the laws on the books and their implementation in practice."⁴ Many countries have passed legislation to enforce their international responsibilities but have failed to provide mechanisms to ensure women are actually protected.⁵ Whether it be due to a lack of financial resources,

"In theory, Costa Rica currently has the laws in place to protect women against sexual violence and femicide. Nonetheless, as a culture heavily influenced by machismo, sexual violence and femicide continues to prevail in Costa Rican society. Specifically, the way machista ideologies are interwoven into the laws protects abusers rather than survivors, making prosecutions and convictions less likely".

"In 2016, 88% of the cases filed for violence against women were not prosecuted. In 2018, there were a total of 27 femicides, but only 10 convictions under the femicide law. Regarding sexual violence, there was a clear lack of prosecution and accountability. In 2019, there were 12,348 reports of sexual violence including rape, sexual relationships with minors, pornography distribution, and sexual abuse of women over eighteen. Nonetheless, there were only 1,669 sentences, setting a conviction rate of 14%".






